Every day, up to millions of people across the world still get infected with COVID-19.

- Some must take time off work to recover, others might have more severe symptoms and need hospital care.
- Many people also suffer from long-term complications such as “brain fog” or fatigue (‘long covid’), which may occur weeks to months after an initial infection.



That is why it is important to be up to date in your vaccination, wash your hands regularly, prioritize meeting outside or in well ventilated areas, and following your local public health recommendations.
