Gaps in Canada's historic narrative widen, while Canadians lack consensus when asked who first discovered and settled Canada

The gap in the historic narrative widens between Quebec and the rest of Canada

A recent Leger ACS survey (June 10-12) revealed that Canadians are increasingly questioning the idea that Canada was founded by two peoples, and that any reference to the country's beginnings must also incorporate Indigenous peoples. The rethinking of Canada's historic narrative is further confirmed by a July 8-10 survey which reveals that when Canadians are asked about who discovered Canada and who settled Canada the largest plurality of respondents say it is Indigenous peoples, in both instances. When it comes to the discovery of Canada, this is especially the case outside of Quebec and amongst respondents under the age of 35. However taken together, the responses reveal that there is much more of a consensus within Quebec over who discovered Canada and who first settled it. Despite the relative lack of consensus outside of Quebec, Canadians believe that they have a good knowledge of their history and remain proud of Canada's past regardless of the degree to which they assess their knowledge.

The findings arise from a Leger survey for the ACS that was conducted between July 8 to July 10, 2022 via web panel with 1764 Canadians. No margin of error can be associated with a non-probability sample (Web panel in this case). However for comparative purposes, a probability sample of 1764 respondents would have a margin of error of ±2.5%, 19 times out of 20



When asked who discovered Canada one in five Canadians say it is Indigenous persons, one in six name Jacques Cartier, and one in eight believe it is Columbus. Respondents under 55 are more likely to identify Indigenous persons before Cartier while those over 55 place the latter first

When asked who discovered Canada the majority of Canada's francophones say it was Jacques Cartier, followed by Christopher Columbus, while a significant minority of English and allophone Canadians select Indigenous persons but data points to little consensus on the issue
