Introduction


Canada History Week 2022 takes place from **November 21 to 27**. This year's theme is Arts, Culture, and Creators. The week encourages Canadians to reflect upon and engage with Canada's past. Canada History Week is organized by the Canada History Fund. To mark this year's edition of Canada's History week, the Association for Canadian Studies commissioned the firm Leger to survey Canadians on their arts and cultural consumption habits. The survey looks specifically at Canadians preferred genre of art, music and film and the extent and the popularity of indigenous art in the country.

The findings arise from a Leger survey for the ACS that was conducted between November 3 to November 5, 2022 via web panel with 1704 Canadians. No margin of error can be associated with a non-probability sample (Web panel in this case). However for comparative purposes, a probability sample of 1764 respondents would have a margin of error of ±2.5%, 19 times out of 20






Nearly one in two Canadians have original artwork in their home


Amongst those Canadians who own an original work of art some <u>one in five</u> say they own Indigenous art






Nearly <u>one in six</u> Canadians say Indigenous art is their favorite genre with nearly <u>one in four</u> in BC that say so


Contemporary and modern art are Canadians preferred genres of art while one in six say they prefer Indigenous art









Comedy and action are Canadians preferred genres of movie




Biggest differences across the age spectrum in movie genre preferences are in Comedy, Drama and Animated movies.




What genre(s) of movies do you prefer?




Canadians preferred genres of music are rock and pop



Generational gap in musical preferences reflected in preferences over rock, pop, hip hop and folk




While most Canadians do not have a favorite musician and no one artist stands out, **Brian Adams gets most mentions**


