Do We Remember? Examining Canadians Knowledge of World War I and II

Introduction

Remembrance Day was first observed in 1919 throughout the British Commonwealth. It was originally called "Armistice Day" to commemorate armistice agreement that ended the First World War on Monday, November 11, 1918, at 11 a.m.—on the eleventh hour of the eleventh day of the eleventh month. During the Second World War Remembrance commemorations declined as focus switched from remembering the previous war to fighting the current one, and after 1945 both wars were remembered during services that were held on the Sunday closest to November 11th.

Increasingly, the contemporary commemorations of Remembrance Day seek to mark the Veterans of all military conflicts in which Canadians have been engaged. It is to be fully expect that memory and knowledge about the 2 World Wars will diminish with time notably in the absence of school programs that aim at supporting education about the 20th century conflicts that served as the basis for Remembrance Day. That which follows looks at Canadians knowledge about the two World Wars by asking questions about when they respectively began, inviting respondents to self assess their knowledge, asking whether they participated in Veteran's week commemorations and about their personal ties to the military.

The web survey was conducted by Leger for the Association for Canadian Studies from November 11 to 13, 2022, with 1,537 Canadians, 18 years of age or older, randomly recruited from LEO's online panel.

A margin of error cannot be associated with a non-probability sample in a panel survey. For comparison, a probability sample of 1,537 respondents would have a margin of error of $\pm 2.51\%$, 19 times out of 20.
