### Immigration and Refugee Numbers: What's 'Up'?

#### Introduction

The 2023-2025 Federal Government Immigration Levels Plan, set its immigration target for 2023 at 465,000 new permanent residents. The government proposes admitting 485,000 new permanent residents in 2024 and another 500,000 in 2025. Already for 2023 the country is on track to exceed 500 000 new permanent residents.

At the time the plans were announced (<a href="https://www.canada.ca/en/immigration-refugees-citizenship/news/2022/11/an-immigration-plan-to-grow-the-economy.html">https://www.canada.ca/en/immigration-refugees-citizenship/news/2022/11/an-immigration-plan-to-grow-the-economy.html</a>) in November 2022 public opinion as assessed by IRCC showed a fair degree of openness to immigration increases especially as the country came of the pandemic. But opinion on increased immigration have shifted considerably into negative territory revealed in a September 25-29 survey conducted by Leger for the Association for Canadian Studies via web panel. The detailed survey also examines the extent to which Canadians are aware of actual numbers of immigrants and refugees that reside in Canada overall and those admitted on an annual basis. Finally we examine the extent to which housing challenges are contributing to uneasiness about the numbers of immigrants admitted yearly.

The Leger survey was conducted during the week of September 25<sup>th,</sup> 2023 for the Association for Canadian Studies and the Metropolis Institute via web panel with 1502 Canadians. A margin of error cannot be associated with a non-probability sample in a panel survey for comparison purposes. A probability sample of 1502 respondents would have a margin of error of ±2.5%, 19 times out of 20.



#### There has been an unprecedented increase over the course of the year in the extent to which Canadians feel that there are too many refugees coming to Canada

As regards numbers of immigrants there are few differences across gender and age in the extent to which Canadians feel that there are too many immigrants with nearly one in two holding this view

As regards the numbers of refugees there is relatively close proximity in the extent to which Canadians feel that there are too many. Only those Canadians under 35 are somewhat less likely than others to feel that there are too many refugees. Persons born outside of Canada are also a bit less likely than the national average to feel that way
