#### Covereaction? The Divide over lessons from the Pandemic

#### Introduction

What lessons did Canadians draw from the Covid 19 pandemic? To address that key question we commissioned the firm Leger Marketing to ask Canadians three questions:

- 1) Thinking back to the handling of the Covid-19 pandemic, do you think the government's response was excessive, appropriate/balanced or insufficient/didn't take the threat seriously enough
- 2) Thinking back to the handling of the Covid-19 pandemic, do you think your personal response was excessive, appropriate/balanced or insufficient/didn't take the threat seriously enough
- 3) Thinking about the pandemic, please tell us in a sentence or two what was the main lesson(s) that you learned?

An additional question inquired into whether Canadians were aware of the number of deaths from Covid 19 both around the globe and in Canada. The purpose of that question was to determine whether such knowledge had any bearing on how one self-assessed their reaction to the pandemic

The Leger survey was conducted during the week of September 25<sup>th,</sup> 2023 for the Association for Canadian Studies and the Metropolis Institute via web panel with 1502 Canadians. A margin of error cannot be associated with a non-probability sample in a panel survey for comparison purposes. A probability sample of 1500 respondents would have a margin of error of ±2.5%, 19 times out of 20.
