Canadian Opinion of Intergroup Relations, Selected Groups and Viewing Expressions of Hate in the Midst of Unprecedented International Tension

Introduction and Methodology

As we world witnesses unprecedented international tensions with the ongoing war between Israel and Hamas what changes have arisen in the state of intergroup relations, positive and negative opinion of selected groups and which groups are the most likely to be the object of hate. To answer these questions, a Leger marketing survey was conducted for the Association for Canadian Studies during the week of October 27-29, 2023.

The survey reveals that a majority of Canadians are worried about relations between Muslims and Jews, Muslims and non-Muslims and immigrants and non-immigrants.

The survey was conducted via web panel with 1632 Canadians. A margin of error cannot be associated with a non-probability sample in a panel survey for comparison purposes. A probability sample of 1632 respondents would have a margin of error of ±2.5%, 19 times out of 20
