# Canadians' Knowledge about the Charter of Rights: Marking 75 years since the adoption of the UN's Universal Declaration of Human Rights

#### Introduction

To mark the 75<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the UN Declaration Universal Declaration of Human Rights (adopted on December 10<sup>th</sup>, 1948), the Association for Canadian Studies asked Leger Marketing to conduct a survey of Canadians that looked at knowledge of the Canadian Charter of Rights, at those rights that Canadians feel are currently most in need of protection. We also asked a question on whether Canadians felt we're all born with an equal chance to succeed in the country, a variation on Article 1 of the UN Declaration which states that: "All human beings are born free and equal in dignity and rights...".

#### Part 1

How familiar are Canadians with our Charter of Rights and Freedoms?

According to a Leger survey for the Association for Canadian Studies, some one in three Canadians say they have read the Charter. And yet, Canadians are divided when asked whether "Canada is founded upon principles that recognize the supremacy of God and the rule of law" despite that being the opening line in the Charter. Also while most Canadians recognize that the government of Canada can limit rights and freedoms, a substantial percentage either disagree or don't know that to be the case. We also asked which right (s) Canadians felt were most in need of protection and it was freedom of expression and the right to privacy that emerged as the top answers.

#### Methodology

The Leger survey was conducted during the week of September 25th, 2023 for the Association for Canadian Studies and the Metropolis Institute via web panel with 1502 Canadians. A margin of error cannot be associated with a non-probability sample in a panel survey for comparison purposes. A probability sample of 1502 respondents would have a margin of error of ±2.5%, 19 times out of 20
