INTRODUCTION AND METHODOLOGY

As the United States approaches a defining Presidential election, most citizens remain very proud of their country as revealed in a survey for Metropolis Institute conducted by Leger USA.

The survey was conducted by the firm Leger Marketing for the Metropolis Institute over the period September 27-29, 2024 with a sample of 1006 Americans. A margin of error cannot be associated with a non-probability sample in a panel survey for comparison purposes. A probability sample of 1612 respondents would have a margin of error of $\pm 3.5\%$, 19 times out of 20.

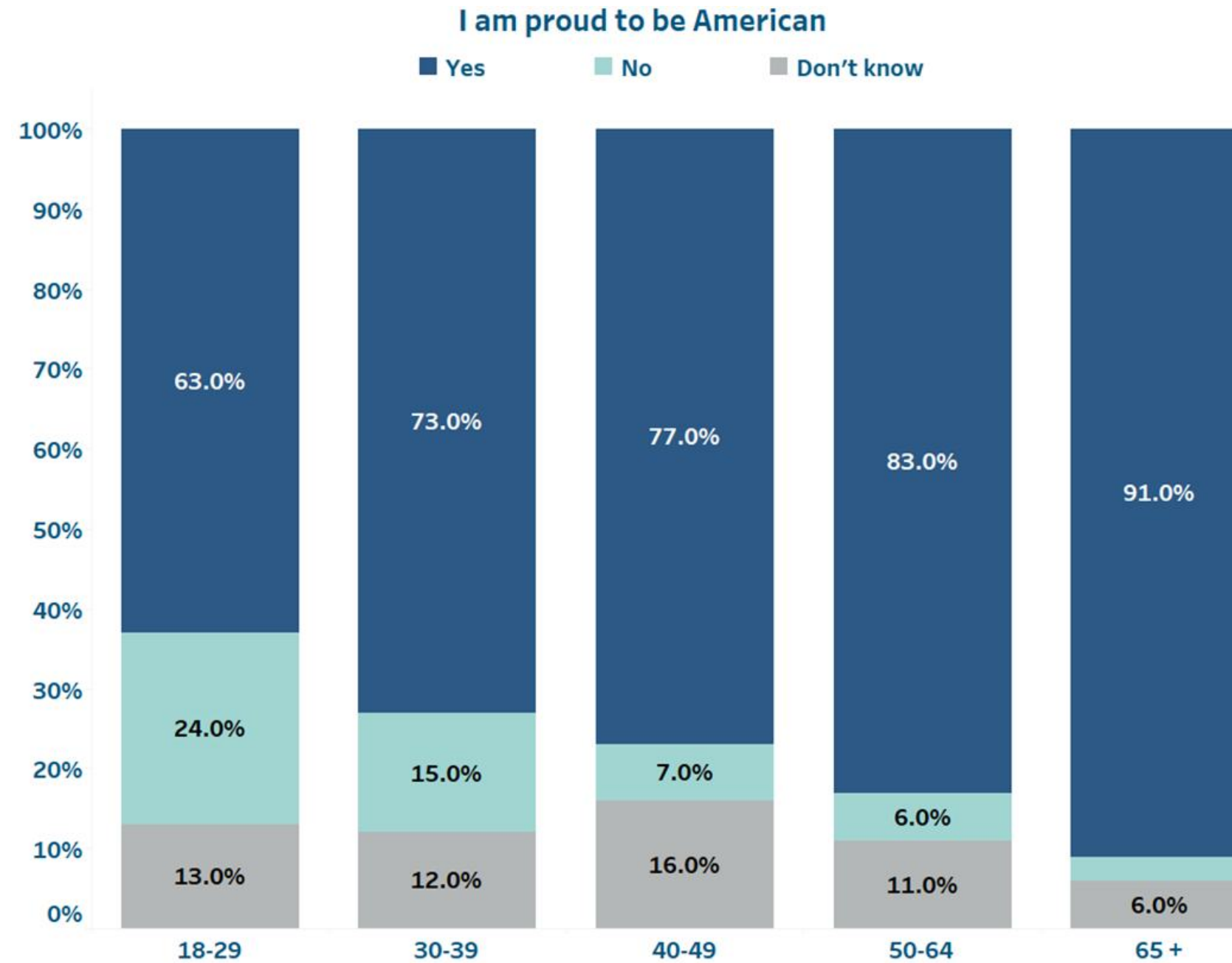
SURVEY RESULTS

I don't know / I prefer not to answer	11%

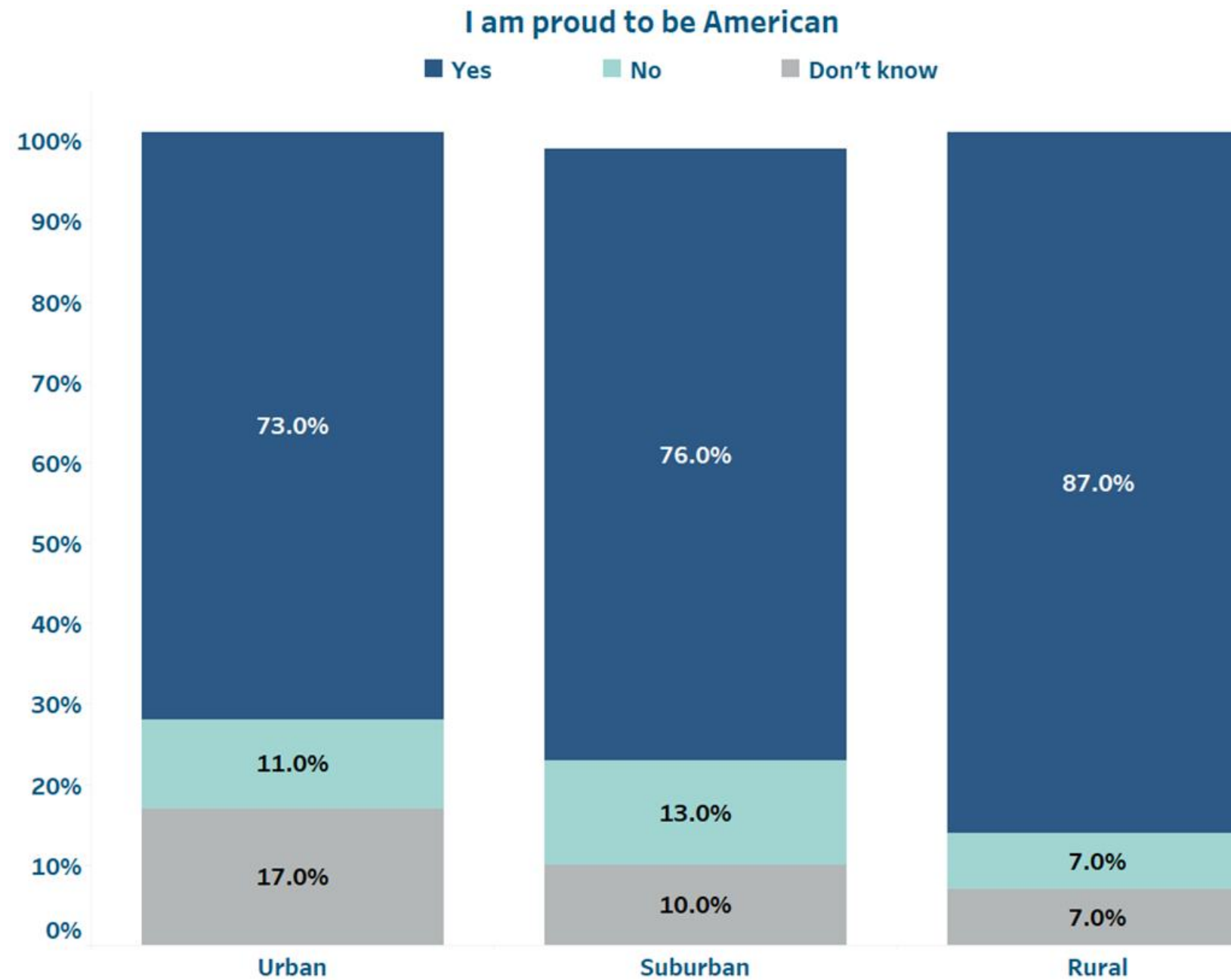
SURVEY RESULTS

Pride in America increases with age with three in ten under 30 saying they are least proud



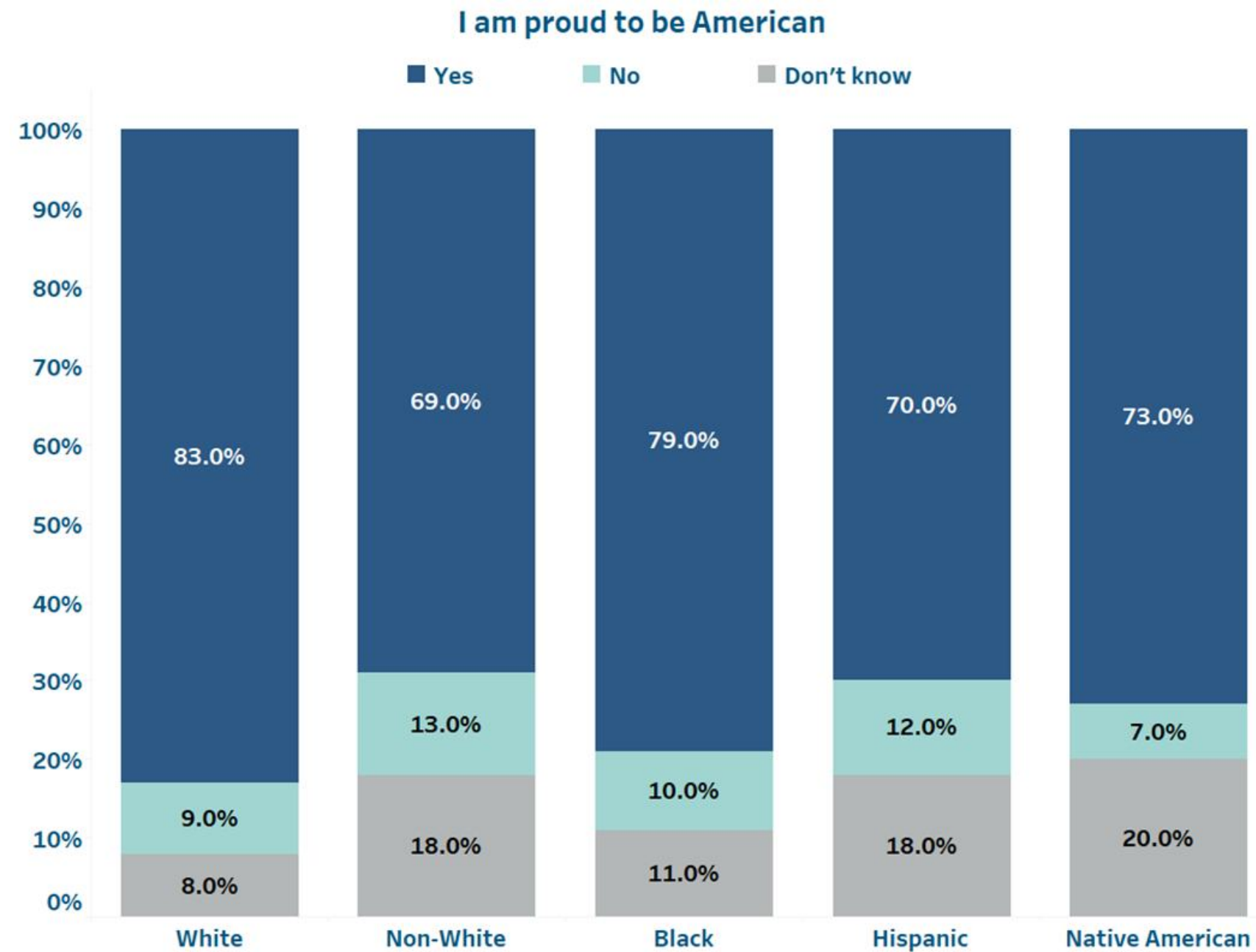
SURVEY RESULTS

SURVEY RESULTS

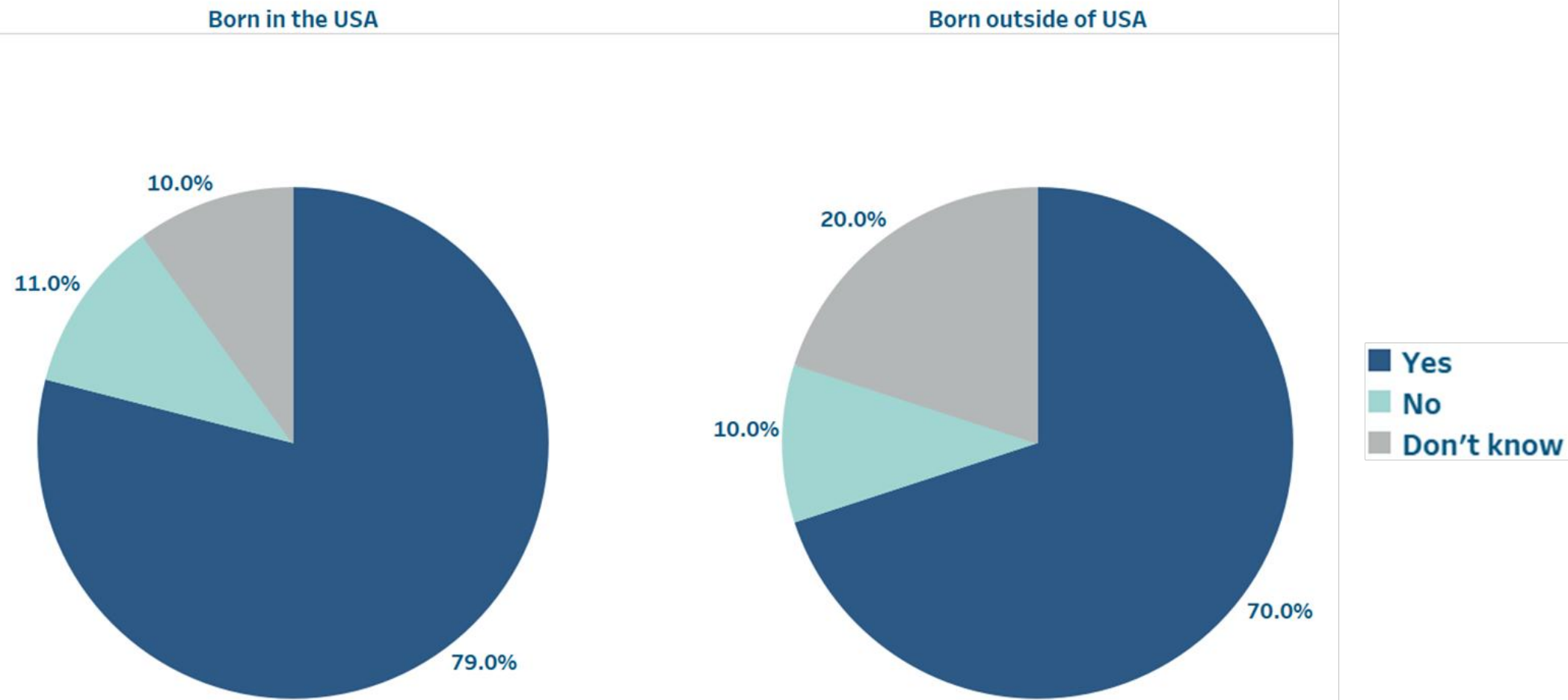
Those Americans identifying as White are most likely to be proud while those identifying as Hispanic are less likely

I am proud to be American



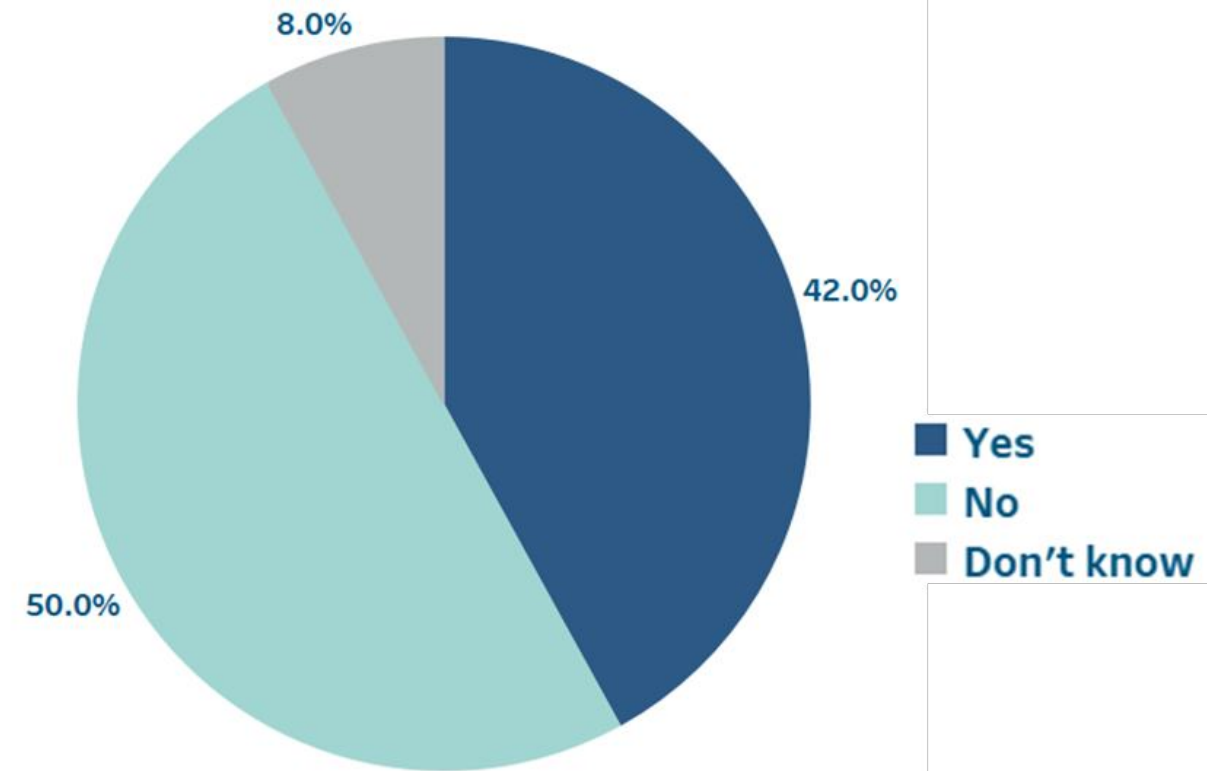
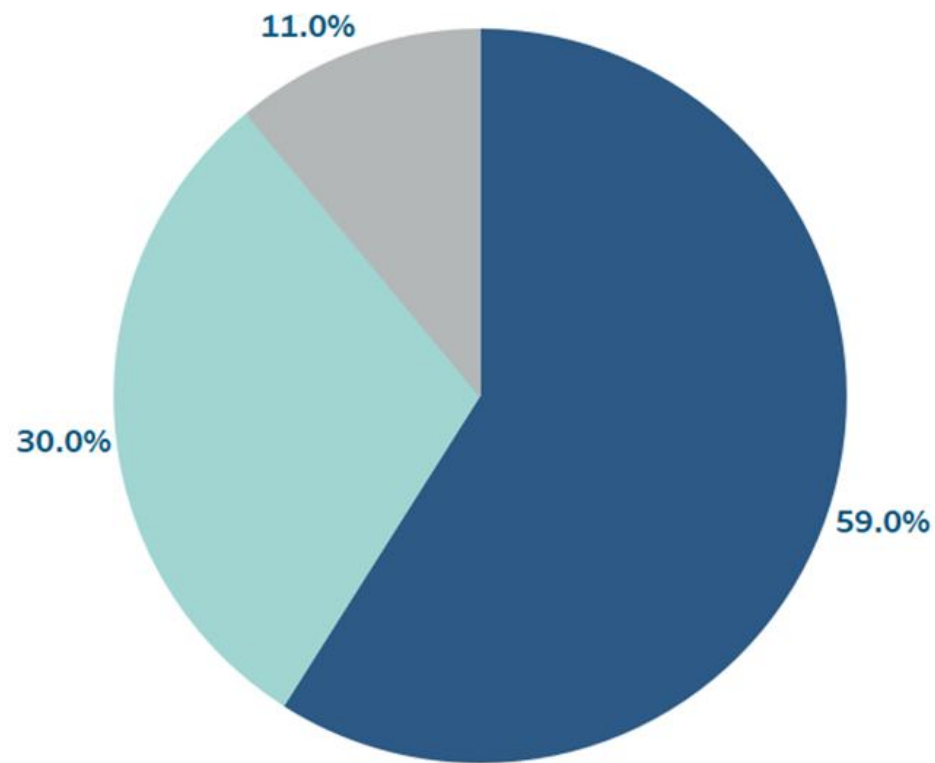
SURVEY RESULTS
